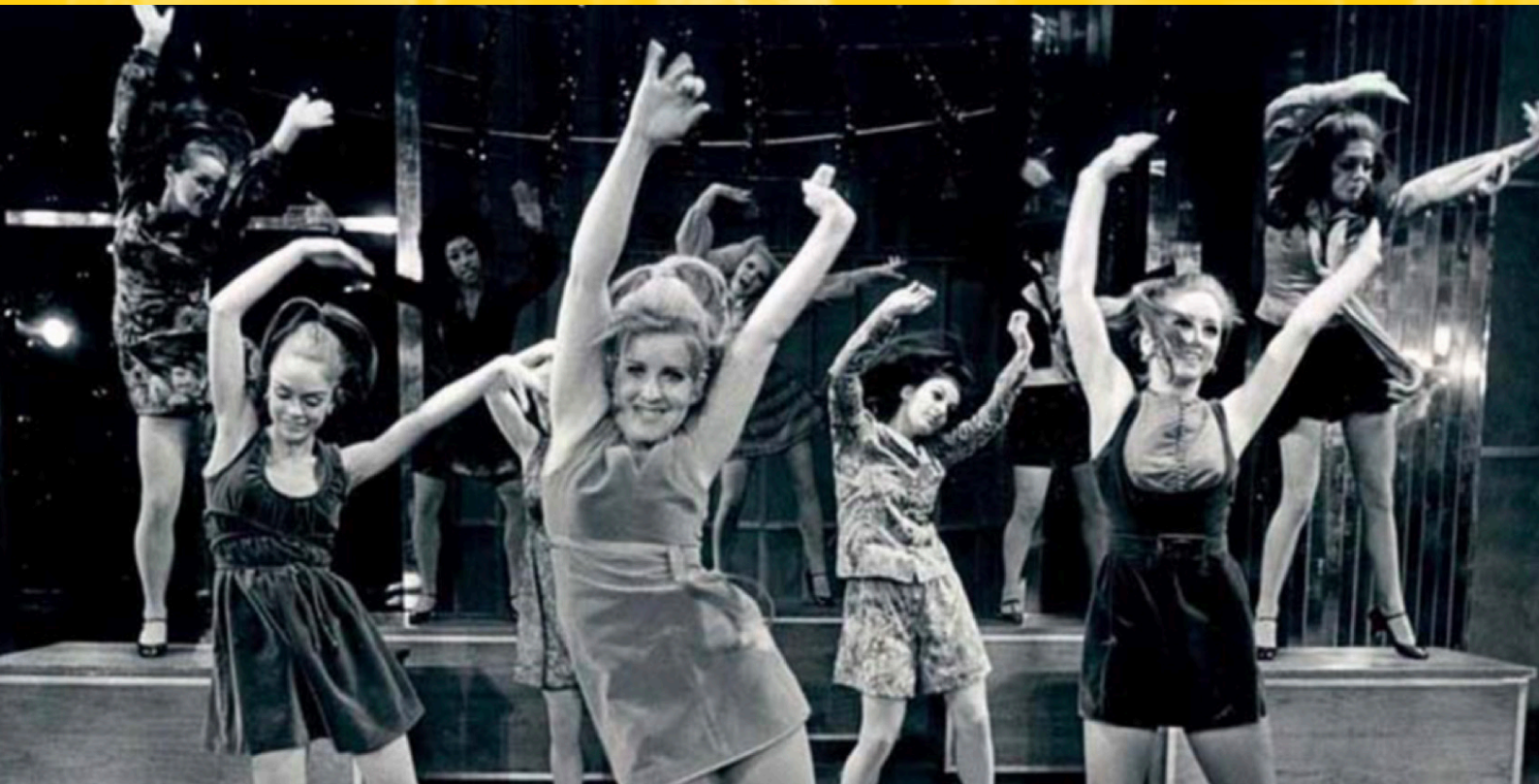
There is plenty of complimentary parking. Attractive setting surrounded by park and garden areas.

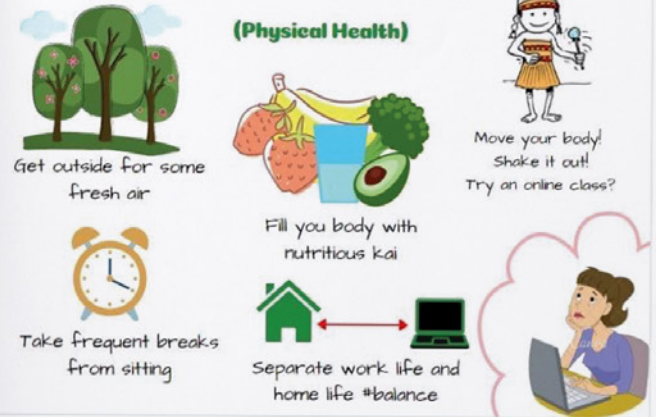

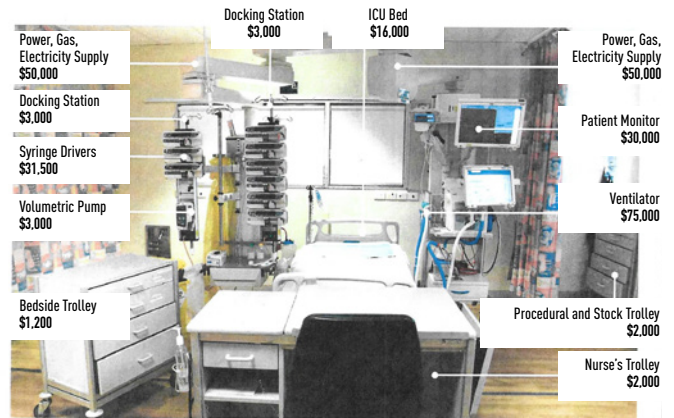

PAEDIATRIC INTENSIVE CARE UNIT (PICU)

Total cost of an ICU Room: \$406,700



ICU equipment \$266,700 + Est. cost to build an ICU bed space \$140,000

As mentioned in our June District 202K Newsletter, the Starship Foundation is raising funds for an expansion of their PICU rooms. Warkworth Lions Club on behalf of the clubs in District K is spearheading a fundraising drive to raise **\$406,700** for a complete PICU cubicle on behalf of Lions Clubs of New Zealand.

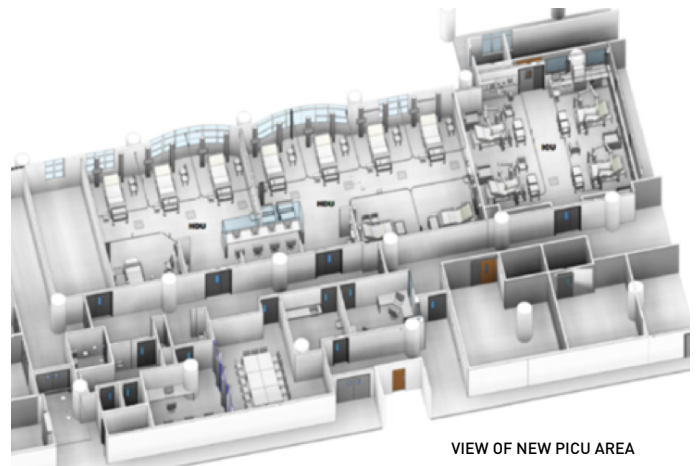
Fundraising across the country has slowed due to Covid but it remains a very active mission to reach our target as soon as possible as the need has never been greater.

The Warkworth Lions Trust account for this PICU appeal is **02-0480-0015374-97**.

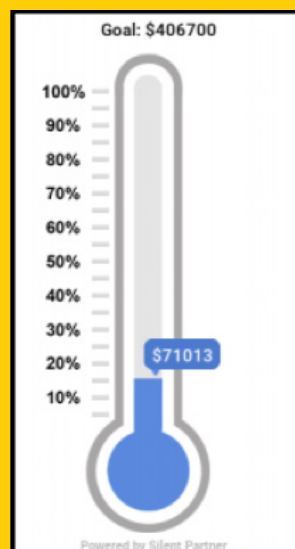

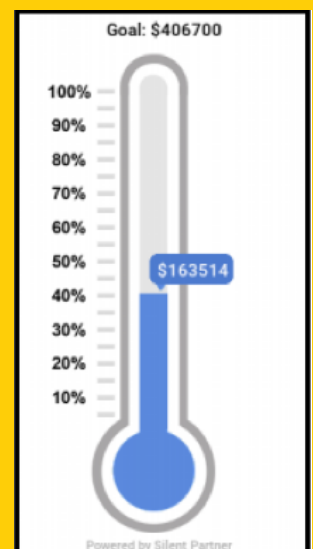


VIEW OF NEW PICU AREA

The wall didn't say a word either, just gave me a blank stare.

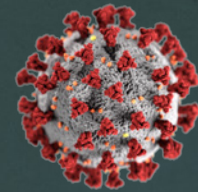
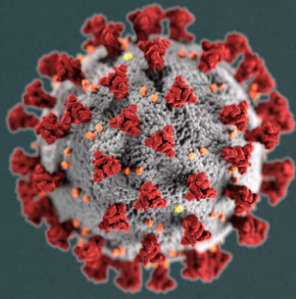
The doorknob was more forthcoming - told me to get a firm grip on the situation and move on.

Friday today and I will let you know how it all happens next week.

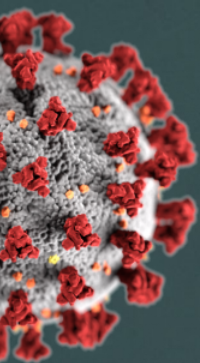
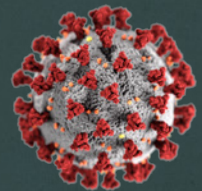


COVID-19

DELTA 2 RULES

Lions Club of Ruawai

- Physical distancing of one metre outside home (including on public transport).
- Gatherings of up to 50 people indoors and 100 outdoors allowed while maintaining physical distancing and contact tracing requirements.
- Sport and recreation activities are allowed if conditions on gatherings are met, physical distancing is followed and travel is local.
- Public venues can open but must comply with conditions on gatherings, and undertake public health measures.
- Health services operate as normally as possible.
- Most businesses open, and business premises can be open for staff and customers with appropriate measures in place.
