


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ello Fellow Lions, and friends of the lions family,

Bound together by cancer. IT ALL STARTED WHEN...

Chalky received the news that he never expected. He had pancreatic cancer. Despite the prognosis, he felt lucky and wanted to help other people whose lives were being affected by cancer.

So, with the help of family and friends, Kevin 'Chalky' Carr set up the Chalky Carr Trust with a vision to raise funds to make a practical impact for a person living with a cancer diagnosis or their family members who need support through the journey.

He never let the 'rust' define him and want to leave a lasting legacy.

Their Charity's vision is to raise funds to make a practical impact for a person living with a cancer diagnosis or their family members who need support through the journey.

Since its inception the trust has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for various projects. These include:

- Providing financial security for a little girl, Isla, who lost her mother to cancer at a young age. 18
 Specialist oncology chairs costing \$150,000 that are in place in Christchurch hospital, Chalky's Chairs.
- An oncology patient car service, 'Chalky's Cars' taking patients to and from treatment without any worry. Over 2000 journeys have been funded so far.
- Provided multiple Chalky Carr scholarships to the University of Canterbury. Lincoln University
 and Ara (for a students who have been effected/impacted by cancer). A further four scholarships
 have been awarded in November 2022.
- An initiative providing 'Chalky's Meals' for oncology out-patients delivered to home.
- Raised \$100,000 to fund early bowel cancer detection testing at Canterbury Charity Hospital.
 This was initiated through an incredible Watt bike marathon. All Blacks High Performance Coach
 Nic Gill smashed out a new world record, cycling 781kms in 24 hours! We went on to complete
 our fundraising goal through the generosity of many at The Chalky Carr Trust Party at Te Pae in
 September 2022.

The Charity achieves this with no staff but rather a voluntary board of trustees, so every dollar donated goes towards helping someone who has been impacted by cancer.

- Lawrence Lions Club did the 'last Hurrah Bike Ride Trail Fun Day at Craigallachie with over 1258 riders participating. They partnered with the Lawrence Area School PTA by providing lunches. The Lawrence Bike Club was also involved with the marking out of the route
- Gore Hokonui Lions Club and the Waihopai City Lions Club participated in the Hospice Street Day Collection
- Waihopai City Lions manned the gates at the Teretonga Raceway over a 2 day event
- Toi Tois Lions Club raised funds from the sale of goods from their chip wagon. They also donated to a family after a farming accident
- Riverton Lions Club donated funds to assist with a pre-school's trikathon
- Gore River Valley Club and the Invercargill Lions Host Club donated money towards the purchase of items for the raffle for the M D Convention to be held in Invercargill in April
- Gore Pakeke Lions Club donated \$15,000 towards scholarships for students from their local high schools for further study at a University or technical studies. This money came from their recycling project of cardboard and plastic wrap.

WHY SERVICE REPORTING MATTERS:

People want to participate in real, visible change. Service reporting allows Lions Clubs to continually engage their communities, tell their story more effectively, and ultimately grow their member base. This encourages new members to join Lions. 

Once she has completed her floristry work Beatrice will always ask what else she can do.

After a particularly wet evening made ground conditions impossible for emergency services to push a patient and gurney to a helicopter waiting in the nearby rugby field, first responder and firefighter Tim Dickey put forward the proposal to Lawrence Lions to build an all-weather rescue helipad. There was no hesitation and a working committee of 9 was set up with Lion Min Bain as Convenor.

A lot of preliminary behind the scene work was undertaken with Tim doing the red tape juggling act. Lions members canvassed local contractors. Designs approved, consents got, thoughts then turned to how to raise the estimated \$70.000. Then Covid 19 struck. Delays were inevitable.

Tasked with raising the funds, the historically successful Stars in Their Eyes event was resurrected with outstanding results. It was a case of all hands on deck as club members amassed 203hrs to pull off a great event. Armed with the necessary funds, work steamed ahead, with a storm water ditch cleared, piped and filled and a retaining wall built in an effort to reclaim enough land necessary for the helipad and rotor exclusion zone.



Further delays due to Covid halted work but not spirits and in true Lion tradition the members rallied. Boxing and footing for the helipad were made and on one of the coldest days imaginable spirits soared as the first concrete for the pad was poured. This required commitment from every committee member and a few ring-ins as well. Next to pour was the adjoining ramp and ambulance bay enabling the seamless transition of the patient to the helicopter. The concreted helipad hardly had time to dry before it was used in a medical emergency proving how important an asset it was. Having the lights and windsock wired up and working helped assist pilot navigation and a textbook landing. 8th of April 2022 being the date when the helipad was fully operational.

Protective bollards and railing were erected to safeguard the helipad and ambulance bay and a final spreading of metal chip around the perimeter heralded the end of the work.

Having taken 2 years to complete it was easy to forget the 100 hours in planning meetings, the more than 39 working bees and the 700 plus man hours, the freezing cold hands and bent backs, the raking, dragging and lifting. There is great strength in a team that truly works together in service.

Being able to hand over a cheque for \$27,000 to Otago Rescue Helicopter Trustee was a fitting culmination of a job well done.




The trust has been formed so it is now time to start fundraising for the skin screening service to:

I have recently updated the contact details on the District Facebook page, and renewed the link to the National website page.

Emails

It may be only March, but the year will progress quickly and as clubs move towards changing officers please encourage the use of the Lions clubs emails. I know of quite a few cases where the officer has resigned or left and the clubs' emails which were attached to their personal email are gone forever. This creates all sorts of problems when correspondence, email address' s and history is lost.

It's as simple as contacting the Postmaster <u>MD202.postmaster@lionsclubs.org.nz</u> and requesting an email address for the club. Making sure that this along with the updated Officer information is entered online for the 202F directory in April/May. Lion's emails have a virus protection and also it's so easy to open that email address and not have to wade through heaps of personal information to find Lions information. I operate 5 Lions emails and the correspondence is kept separated from my personal email and when I relinquish any of those roles it is just a matter of contacting the postmaster, updating the details and password and the new person receives the Lions emails, with all the previous history attached. No frustration of continually getting unwanted emails from your previous position in Lions.

I will have information circulated to the Lions clubs on setting up the email and if leaving a position with a Lions email how to change this over to the new person.

Please remember replying to any emails to only push the reply button **only** as "reply all" can clog up

everyone's inboxes very quickly.

Get Lions ready for the Lion Portal

We're preparing for the launch of the new Lion Portal. This refreshed experience will combine the functionality of MyLion, MyLCI, Insights and other tools into one cohesive and consistent experience.

To use the Lion Portal, Lions must have a unique email address (one that isn't shared with another member) in their Lion Account information. Additionally, phone numbers can no longer be used as log in credentials.

Here's how you can help Lions:

- Spread the word. Make Lions especially those who actively use their Lion Account —
 aware of the transition to the Lion Portal. Encourage them to make sure their member
 information is up to date and includes a unique email address.
- 2. Prepare club officers. Ask club officers to review the member records for their club, checking for any shared email addresses, and be prepared to help members update their information as needed. If District 202F Lions clubs can work on updating this information over the next few months before the information needs to be sent for the 2023-2024 directory, it would be much appreciated. Please send a list around your Lions club and ask them to write their personal email, correct address and contact number and update before the date requested
