The Lions of the District welcomed us and we heard of many stories and heroes.


achievements Conferences are often judged on the venue and the food. Both were excellent. Thank you to the Firefighters who volunteered

It was such an amazing experience to watch this presentation at the Convention in Invercargill and witnessing the Cromwell Lions Club receiving the MD Kindness Matters Award for this

current year. Their project of supporting Tongans living in the outer islands of Tonga after the January 2022 submarine volcano erupted in the Tongan Islands, causing loss of life and severe damage due to tsunamis and ash fallout was a really strong project of community involvement in their own area as well as the Tongan Communities. This Club worked alongside the Clyde & Districts Lions Club and the Queenstown Lions Club who made a significant financial contribution while the Cromwell Lake Dunstan Lions donated goods and also helped sort and pack donations, along with businesses in their local area, schools and the media.
