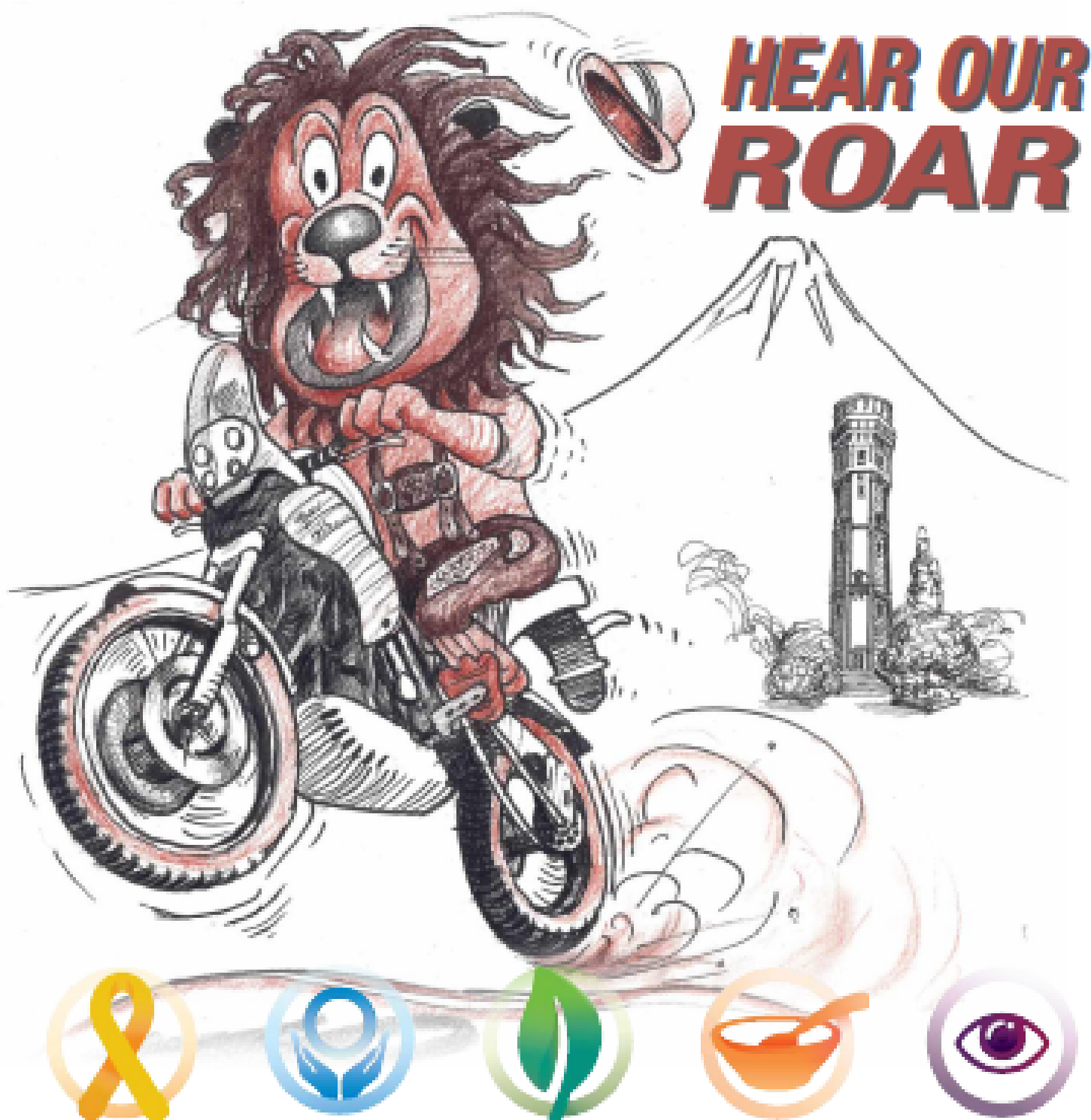

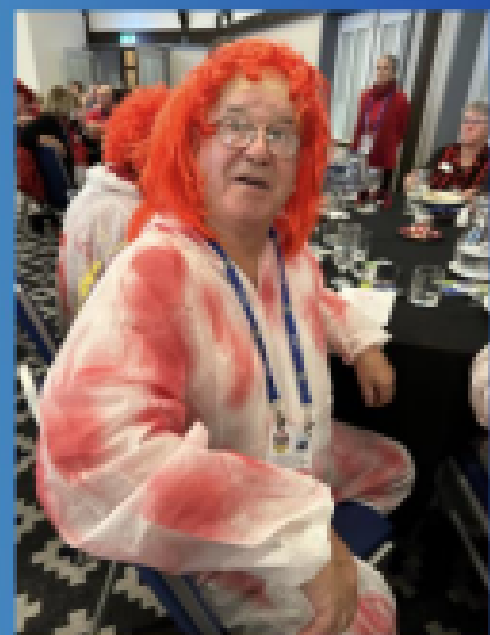

Stalls pricing \$50—\$70 or are free to local charity and other local not-for-profit organisations.

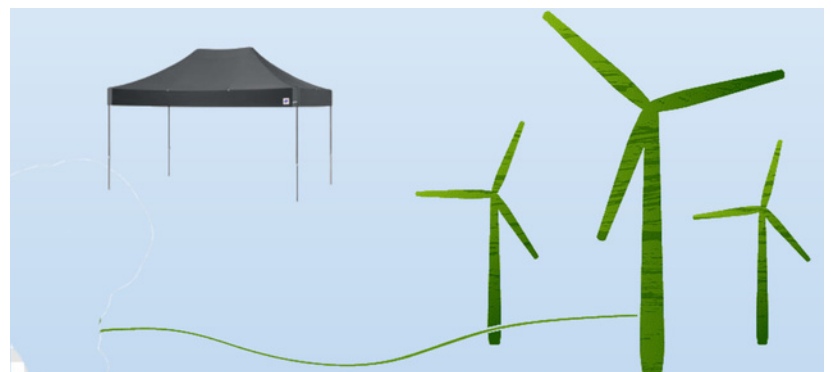

Our team with the Glob has been out to Waituna West Cluster schools cross country. 26 people checked and 6 referred to their GP. A good cross section of rural folk from young mums to farmers, & grandparents. Definitely worthwhile and likely on next year's calendar.

This week MDC made an Outstanding Community Service award to Dr Warren who chairs the Lions My Health Check Project team. We all know every orchestra needs a Conductor and the Orchestra delivers the music. Well done Conductor Warren.

Mentoring support continues with Timaru and South Canterbury Lions Club as they establish their health check project called ARCHIE (Aorangi Rural Community Health Initiative Event) with the McKenzie Basin District Council Emergency Resource Trailer being made available as ARCHIE, their "Glob" equivalent.

South Taranaki Lions are in the process of finding a suitable caravan, they have some nurses, and Lions Clubs to provide FOH, and currently hunting for a Dr.

Public Health Unit discussions for use of their Campervan for Manawatu and Wairarapa and Hawkes Bay site visits in the future.

Currently we have seen 1400 people and 360 referred to their GP.
