

- Work with your local schools to obtain and screen contestants (ensuring entrants are in good health and of good character)
- Pay the entrance fee of \$50 (Online banking 03 0791 0232608 05. Ref Club Name)
- To ensure all documentation and payment is lodged with District Youth Chairman by stipulated date.
- To arrange transport for contestant/s to District contest if necessary and support as required.
- To inform their contestants of all relevant details regarding the conditions of the contest

Peace Poster...

The theme for the 2024-2025 Peace Poster "PEACE WITHOUT LIMITS" Entry eligibility: Age 11 – 13 as of 15 November



- Clubs may purchase Peace Poster kits https://www.lionsclubs.org.nz/shop/peace-poster-kit between Jan 15 & 1 Oct.
- · Schools should be contacted early March 2024
- All Posters MUST be made to required size anything different will not be accepted. THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT!!!!!!
- Club to provide students with A2 size (420mmx594mm) acid & lignin free art paper no less than 100gsm in weight. This can be purchased from Warehouse Stationary.
- All entries must be flexible enough to be rolled up for shipping in 6cm diameter tubes.
- Pencils, pens, crayons, markers, paint, or chalk may be used. Entries should be sprayed to prevent smearing.
- 3D entries will not be accepted. Nothing may be glued, stapled or attached to the artwork in any way.
- Signatures or initials and brief description should be written on the back of the artwork. (See attachment).
- NO LETTERING OR NUMBERS ALLOWED ON THE POSTER
- · Posters must not be laminated.
- Closing date for District judging is 25/10/24. District judging takes place from 30th October. Vouchers will be awarded to the first three places in the district.
- Closing date for the Multiple District Judging is 1/12/24. The winning entry for the district goes forward
 to this competition.
- One grand prize winner (Worldwide) receives US\$5000, a plaque and a trip for two family members to attend the International Awards ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations
- (Subject to change). Each of the 23 merit award winners will receive a cash award of US\$500 and a certificate of achievement.

All entries must be forwarded to Youth Chairs, Stephanie Jordan or Robyn Pederson before closing date.




Lions NZ Skin Cancer Van Getting Closer
