# Instructions for Updating the Club Constitution and re-registering under the Incorporated Societies Act 2022, based on a letter from MD202 Legal Counsel, Alan Knowsley, March 2024.

Lions clubs charter as part of an international association. All clubs from around the world adhere to a standard form constitution. The only changes to the standard form constitution that clubs need to make are those required to meet legislation provisions of their particular country. In the past, for example, New Zealand required a winding up clause to be added.

The Incorporated Societies Act 2022 has brought in several new requirements for all incorporated societies, including Lions Clubs.

Lions MD202 Legal Counsel prepared the Draft Lions Club Constitution (as circulated) that ensures that Club constitutions satisfy both Lions Clubs International requirements and those of the Incorporated Societies Act 2022..

This draft Lions Club constitution was submitted to the Registrar of Incorporated Societies and it has been approved. The good news is that the first Club to use it has been re-registered under the 2022 Act.

The template is now available to assist all other Lions Clubs to meet the re-registration obligation. **There is no charge for re-registration.**

**Clubs that are NOT incorporated at present can register online** by going to the New Zealand Companies Office website and following the instructions on the section headed Incorporated Societies. **To incorporate a new society you need to:**

- ◆ complete an online application,
- ◆ upload your constitution, and
- ◆ pay the application fee \$88.89 (plus GST).

## Updating the Club Constitution and re-registering under the Incorporated Societies Act 2022

### THE FOLLOWING IS AN OUTLINE TO ASSIST CLUBS OF DISTRICT 202J TO COMPLETE THE PROCESS

(Remember: If changes other than name are proposed check with District Legal Chair before putting to Club for adoption)

**Insert your club name in the Constitution** in the two places highlighted.

**Put the new constitution to your club Board** for consideration.

Once approved by the Board, **send a copy to each of your club members giving 14 days' notice of a meeting to vote on adopting the new constitution.**

**At the meeting put the following resolution to the members:**

**“THAT The members of the Lions Club of xxx Incorporated (insert your club name) adopt the new constitution as annexed.”**

**Once approved by the members, the Club should then be re-registered** on the Incorporated Society website.

**Note that this is re-registration under the 2022 Act, not registering a new constitution under the 1908 Act, which is a different process and not to be done in this situation.**

**There is no fee to re-register.**

**Acceptance and a new Certificate of Incorporation should be received within a few days.**

**This process must be completed by April 2026** or else the Club will be deregistered by the Registrar.

**If your Club is NOT registered as an Incorporated Society** at present then the process of registering differs from that of re-registering but it is not onerous and can be done online. Go to the Incorporated Societies section of the New Zealand Companies Office website for details.

## Dunedin Host Donation to Youth Search & Rescue

**D**unedin Host Lions Club Magic Show made a significant donation to the Youth Search and Rescue team of just over \$13,000. This money was used to purchase specialised radio equipment; their whole operation runs off radio and in Dunedin they face the challenges of very dense bush, open country and tussock land, so good radio equipment is a "must have".

There are 15 members in the group between the age of 14 -18, under the guidance of Harrie Geraerts.

This is the first training programme to be held in Dunedin, so the intake is smaller this year, hoping to increase to 24 next year; the course runs for 3 years.

In the first year they learn outdoor based activities, the second year they learn how to manage a team, the third year they learn how to lead a rescue operation.

They participate in a classroom lecture every Wednesday evening and a weekend field exercise once a month. There are also boating and helicopter courses; it's a very intensive course.

These youth become a real asset to the community and one we were proud to support. Ron Coles is the Chairperson of the Trust and over the years has raised a very large amount of money for numerous charities.

Ron has just been awarded a Melvin Jones Fellowship for all his work with the Magic Show Trust and the Dunedin Host Lions club.

Andy has arranged for a transport company to collect them in Dunedin and if they come to PDG Ella she can arrange for them to get to Cromwell. (Design & Garden Landscapes, 205 St Andrew St, Dunedin).

Oamaru: old hearing aids, unused (new) hearing aid batteries, (and spectacles) can also be delivered to DG Derek Wardell 7 Girvan St, Oamaru for delivery to Andy.

- ◆ OLD used, flat batteries are safely disposed of through Bay Audiology or Triton Hearing – take your used (flat) hearing aid batteries to them.

- ◆ Drop off at 2 degrees, Spark & Vodafone shops for the RE:MOBILE scheme which is accredited by the Ministry for the Environment. Sustainable Coastlines benefits.



## Used Spectacles Collection

## Lions Clubs International FOUNDATION

As the world celebrates Humanitarian Day on 19th August, Lions have every right to celebrate their 107 years of working together throughout the world, providing service to those most critically in need.

Since July 2023 until May 2024, our Foundation awarded US\$15.5 million, empowering Lions to provide humanitarian aid where it is needed most. Such grants ranged from \$375 for an intellectual disability awareness event to US\$2.046 million to LCIF Special Olympics.

- ◆ Switzerland - for a clean water project in Tajikistan.
- ◆ Sweden Lions for a clean water project in Somalia.
- ◆ Republic of Korea - white canes for visually impaired and heating gas for homes of people with disabilities.
- ◆ India - to construct a dialysis unit at a Lions Hospital and provide drinking water to schools.
- ◆ Taiwan - rice donations to families in need and they donated bed sets to individuals with cerebral palsy.
- ◆ Japan - for drug abuse prevention educational materials.
- ◆ Lebanon - repaired X-ray machine in a hospital.

- ◆ Australia - provided equipment for St Vincent's Institute of Medical Research.
- ◆ AND NEW ZEALAND - here in the South Island we have received US\$76,000 for our mobile skin cancer screening bus.

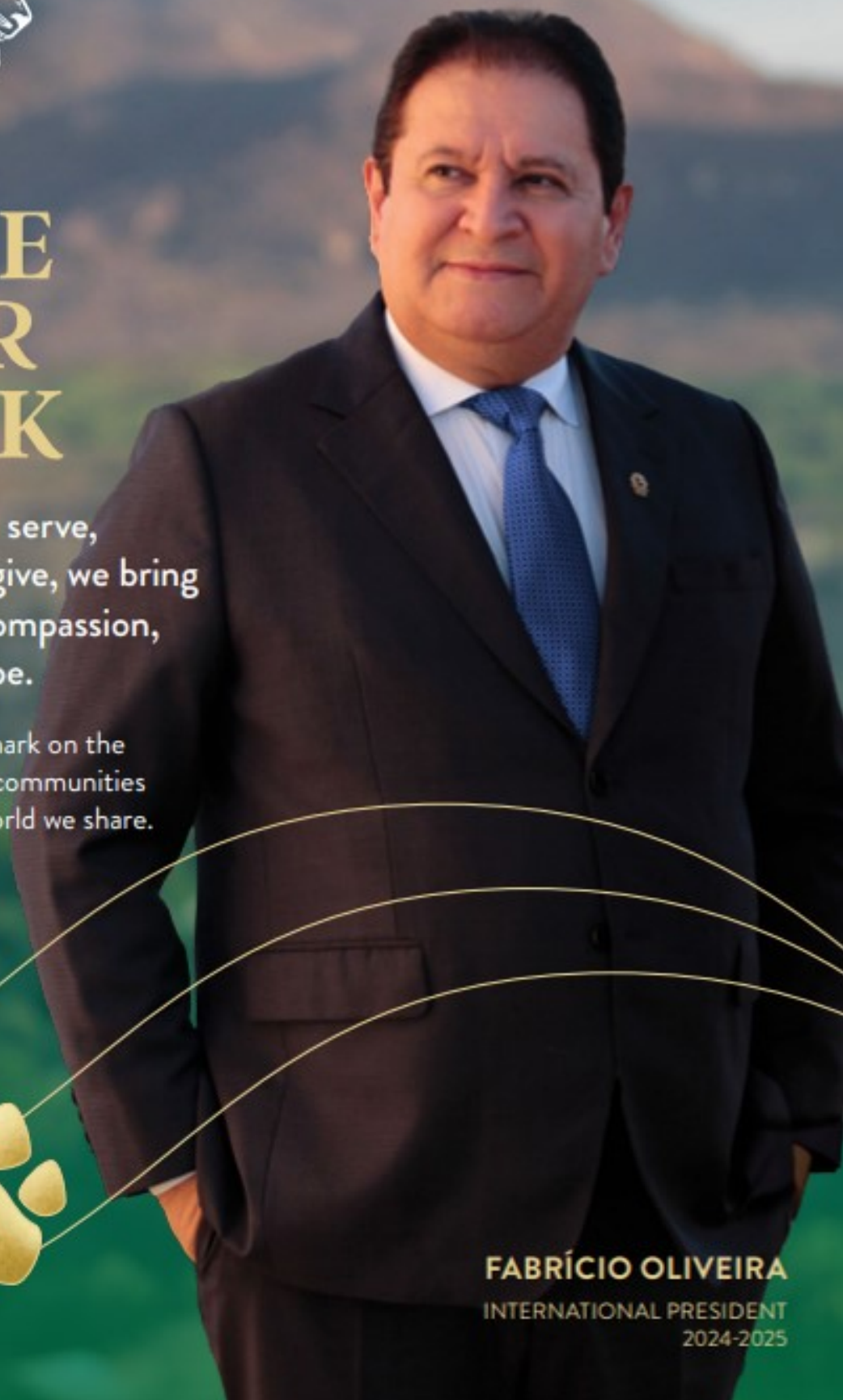
