Lions National Mobile Skin Cancer Screening Service

I he first of the planned two mobile screening buses is scheduled to be handed over from the coach builders at the Lions District 202E Convention in Hanmer Springs. This will be on Friday 28 March 2025. Plans for the purchase of the cab chassis and build and fitout of the second vehicle are progressing well. The Trust hopes many Lions will take the opportunity to view the first vehicle at the Convention and looks forward to continuing support from Clubs in operating and expanding this national project.

The Trust is grateful for donations and other assistance already received. It still seeks donations and grants for the build of the second vehicle and ongoing operational costs. It requests clubs and Lions to deposit donations directly into the Trust Bank account 03-0674-0280918-00; rather than the Give a Little Page which is intended for members of the public.

With the project transitioning from the development to operational phase the Trust now seeks further assistance from clubs in working with the Trust to recruit volunteers to conduct screenings (doctors and nurses) and provide ground support at clinic sites, identifying suitable events and venues for clinic visits and advertising those visits and the local Lions club(s).





Instructions for Updating the Club Constitution and re-registering under the Incorporated Societies Act 2022, based on a letter from MD202 Legal Counsel, Alan Knowsley, March 2024.

Lions clubs charter as part of an international association. All clubs from around the world adhere to a standard form constitution. The only changes to the standard form constitution that clubs need to make are those required to meet legislation provisions of their particular country. In the past, for example, New Zealand required a winding up clause to be added.

The Incorporated Societies Act 2022 has brought in several new requirements for all incorporated societies, including Lions Clubs.

Lions MD202 Legal Counsel prepared the Draft Lions Club Constitution (as circulated) that ensures that Club constitutions satisfy both Lions Clubs International requirements and those of the Incorporated Societies Act 2022.

This draft Lions Club constitution was submitted to the Registrar of Incorporated Societies and it has been approved. The good news is that the first Club to use it has been re-registered under the 2022 Act.

The template is now available to assist all other Lions Clubs to meet the re-registration obligation. **There is no charge for re-registration.**

Clubs that are NOT incorporated at present can register online by going to the New Zealand Companies Office website and following the instructions on the section headed Incorporated Societies. **To incorporate a new society you need to:**

- complete an online application,
- upload your constitution, and
- pay the application fee \$88.89 (plus GST).

Multiple District 202 Mission Statement

Updating the Club Constitution and re-registering under the Incorporated Societies Act 2022

THE FOLLOWING IS AN OUTLINE TO ASSIST CLUBS OF DISTRICT 202J TO COMPLETE THE PROCESS

(Remember: If changes other than name are proposed check with District Legal Chair before putting to Club for adoption)

Insert your club name in the Constitution in the two places highlighted.

Put the new constitution to your club Board for consideration.

Once approved by the Board, send a copy to each of your club members giving 14 days' notice of a meeting to vote on adopting the new constitution.

At the meeting put the following resolution to the members:

"THAT The members of the Lions Club of xxx Incorporated (insert your club name) adopt the new constitution as annexed."

Once approved by the members, **the Club should then be re-registered** on the Incorporated Society website.

Note that this is re-registration under the **2022 Act, not registering a new constitution under** the 1908 Act, which is a different process and not to be done in this situation.

There is no fee to re-register.

Acceptance and a new Certificate of Incorporation should be received within a few days.

This process must be completed by April 2026 or else the Club will be deregistered by the Registrar.

If your Club is NOT registered as an Incorporated Society at present, then the process of registering differs from that of re-registering but it is not onerous and can be done online. Go to the Incorporated Societies section of the New Zealand Companies Office website for details.

ovember 14th heralds World Diabetes Day. Diabetes is recognised as a global epidemic with an estimated 537 million adults between the ages of 20 to 79 years living with the disease. It is estimated a further 240 million cases are undiagnosed. It's predicted by 2045 that numbers will reach 783 million.

Diabetes does not discriminate age as it is estimated 1.2 million of the world's youth suffer from Type 1 diabetes, half of which are under 15 years of age. The most startling statistic is that diabetes claims 6.7 million lives each year.

LCIF is dedicated to empowering Lions and Leos around the world to fight diabetes by promoting awareness and running diabetes service projects. Numerous clubs are involved with diabetes service programmes, screening for Type 2 Diabetes and helping local communities understand the risks of diabetes, and the steps to take towards prevention of the disease. Diabetes Support Groups have been established in some areas to enable those affected to learn more about their disease and how to manage it.

Locally, various clubs stage the annual "Strides for Diabetes" awareness walk.

World Diabetes Day

Through our Foundation, grants are available to support Diabetes service throughout the world which includes running Diabetes Camps to enhance the quality of life for young people living with diabetes, by teaching diabetes management skills.

This year during July and August alone, LCIF awarded Diabetes related grants totalling US\$178,831 which included the purchase of a generator for a camp in Canada. \$US31,995 was awarded to Taiwan for a Diabetes screening education and awareness programme. Similar programmes were set up in Nepal and Japan, whilst in India in the Kerala State, a Diabetes grant of US\$93,815 enabled the expansion of a Diabetes Detection and Management programme.

All this has been possible by Lions clubs such as yours, donating to our International Foundation (LCIF). Please consider making your donation this year to "LCIF's Empowering Service" to enable our Diabetes programmes to grow.


