Who Can Report Service

BUT and there is a BIG BUT. There is no use doing SERVICE unless your Club reports this in the new Portal. If you are having problems with reporting, please let me know as reporting is the key to our success and also to attracting new Members.

It's important for your Club to know who is responsible for Service Reporting, so your Club receives the benefits. In Lions Clubs, many Clubs choose to have the club secretary or club president report. In Leo Clubs, the president, secretary or Leo Club Advisor can report Service. Your Club can also appoint an administrator to handle Service Reporting or your district can appoint an IT chairperson.

When we consider a Project or an Event, this will now be a lot easier with the 8 Causes. One of the biggest problems we have all experienced when it came to Service Reporting, was trying to 'fit' our Project into one of the existing Causes, especially families and youth. So now let's get out there into our communities and promote Lions in such a way that it will become the organisation people want to be involved with now and in the future.

When I am not working, I love catching up with family, gardening and I enjoy walking and going to the gym on a regular basis. I am also chairman of a parish council.





Wanaka and Districts Lions Club will celebrate 50 Years Service to the community at the end of October 2024.



This is a permanent part-time position, commencement date and remuneration to be negotiated.


