

# Instructions for Updating the Club Constitution and re-registering under the Incorporated Societies Act 2022, based on a letter from MD202 Legal Counsel, Alan Knowsley, March 2024.

Lions clubs charter as part of an international association. All clubs from around the world adhere to a standard form constitution. The only changes to the standard form constitution that clubs need to make are those required to meet legislation provisions of their particular country. In the past, for example, New Zealand required a winding up clause to be added.

The Incorporated Societies Act 2022 has brought in several new requirements for all incorporated societies, including Lions Clubs.

Lions MD202 Legal Counsel prepared the Draft Lions Club Constitution (as circulated) that ensures that Club constitutions satisfy both Lions Clubs International requirements and those of the Incorporated Societies Act 2022..

This draft Lions Club constitution was submitted to the Registrar of Incorporated Societies and it has been approved. The good news is that the first Club to use it has been re-registered under the 2022 Act.

The template is now available to assist all other Lions Clubs to meet the re-registration obligation. **There is no charge for re-registration.** 

Clubs that are NOT incorporated at present can register online by going to the New Zealand Companies Office website and following the instructions on the section headed Incorporated Societies. To incorporate a new society you need to:

- complete an online application,
- · upload your constitution, and
- pay the application fee \$88.89 (plus GST).

# Updating the Club Constitution and re-registering under the Incorporated Societies Act 2022

# THE FOLLOWING IS AN OUTLINE TO ASSIST CLUBS OF DISTRICT 202J TO COMPLETE THE PROCESS

(Remember: If changes other than name are proposed check with District Legal Chair before putting to Club for adoption)

**Insert your club name in the Constitution** in the two places highlighted.

Put the new constitution to your club Board for consideration.

Once approved by the Board, send a copy to each of your club members giving 14 days' notice of a meeting to vote on adopting the new constitution.

At the meeting put the following resolution to the members:

"THAT The members of the Lions Club of xxx Incorporated (insert your club name) adopt the new constitution as annexed."

Once approved by the members, the Club should then be re-registered on the Incorporated Society website.

**Note that this is re-registration** under the **2022 Act, not registering a new constitution under** the 1908 Act, which is a different process and not to be done in this situation.

There is no fee to re-register.

Acceptance and a new Certificate of Incorporation should be received within a few days.

This process must be completed by April 2026 or else the Club will be deregistered by the Registrar.

If your Club is NOT registered as an Incorporated Society at present then the process of registering differs from that of re-registering but it is not onerous and can be done online. Go to the Incorporated Societies section of the New Zealand Companies Office website for details.

September is Childhood Cancer Awareness month in New Zealand. Lions and Leos, with the support of LCIF help provide for the needs of children and families affected by Childhood Cancer through impactful service.

The World Health Organization advises that globally 400,000 children are diagnosed with cancer annually of which nine out of every ten of those children live in low or middle-income countries. Sadly only 30% of these children survive compared with 80% in high income countries.

Did you know there are several types of LCIF grants available to support childhood cancer services throughout the world? Childhood cancer grants empower Lions to improve the quality of life for children receiving treatment and their parents.

LCIF matching grants can be utilized to provide equipment and in some cases towards construction, for large scale projects that may be needed to address unmet humanitarian needs such as treatment facilities. The District and Club community impact grant programme which could also be possibly used to fund local childhood cancer projects at a Club and or a District level.

Between July 2023 and May 2024 LCIF awarded 19 childhood cancer related grants totalling \$US1.85 million. Such projects included in Nigeria, upgrading the children's cancer ward in the Calabar Hospital. In Tunisia, through an LCIF grant the air filtration system was upgraded in the children's oncology ward, while in Turkey

equipment was purchased for the Paediatric ward in the Istanbul Hospital. In Brazil a matching US\$100,000 grant enabled the expansion of a Paediatric diagnostic centre at their local hospital. A US\$1 million grant was made to our Global HOPE partnership (fighting childhood cancer in Africa). The aim of this project is to ensure patients, and their families are adequately supported and address the most common barrier in obtaining the necessary treatments. Lions are also raising awareness of the impact of childhood cancer and educating local communities and creating positive changes.

To enable our work, which is to improve outcomes for children with cancer throughout the world, please consider donating to LCIF's "Empowering Service" fund to enable the Foundation to extend its support to the innocent younger people in our world, who are fighting this deadly disease.

Childhood cancer is a battle no child should ever have to fight alone.

With Lions support, we can offer them some hope of a brighter tomorrow.
