The Treasurer Talks

Treasurer & Trustee Guidelines

Since November 2018, trustee and board member information presentations have been held throughout the district, giving Cabinet an understanding and appreciation of the difficulties clubs have had, and continue to have, trying to manage charitable trust and board functions and responsibilities.

When presentations started, it soon became apparent there was considerable confusion around who was responsible for what; mostly as a result of lack of knowledge around New Zealand Charity and Incorporated Society Laws, forgetfulness of Lions Clubs Rules, Regulations, By-Laws and Club Constitutions and general misinformation being handed down – all possibly due to a perceived lack of communication from Multiple District 202.

But now, after receiving 'up to date' advice and support from Multiple District 202 Head Office, Cabinet has put together a new Treasurer & Trustee Guidelines document.

Making this worthwhile information available to clubs as quickly as possible, means it is only available at present in *pdf* form (can be printed and placed in a folder), however it is hoped to soon be available as a soft-cover handbook.

- ◆ **Charitable Trust** file with the Charities Commission within six months of your balance date (for most clubs the deadline will be **30 December**)
- ◆ **Incorporated Society** file with the Companies Office within one month of your AGM
- ◆ **Note** If your club is an Incorporated Society & has a Charitable Trust then you file two separate returns.

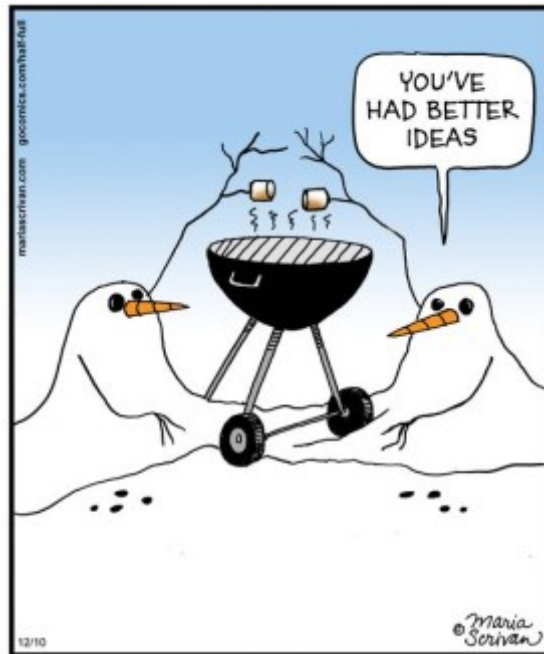

Introducing.... International President Dr Jung-Yul Choi



Dr Jung-Yul Choi of Busan, Republic of Korea, was elected to serve as international president of Lions Clubs International at the association's 102nd International Convention, held in Milan, Italy, July 5 through July 9, 2019.

A member of the Busan Jae-il Lions Club since 1977, President Choi has held many offices within the association, including club president, cabinet secretary, district governor and international director. He also served numerous times as a DGE Group Leader and served on 11 committees as a member of the International Board of Directors. In addition, he was a chairperson of the 39th OSEAL Forum in 2000 and a host committee chairperson at the 95th Lions International Convention in Busan in 2012, the largest convention ever held in Lions history.

In recognition of his service to the association, President Choi has received numerous awards, including the Humanitarian Partnership; Senior Master Key Award; 100% District Governor Award; multiple International President's Leadership Awards; multiple International President's Awards; and an Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. He is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lion activities, President Choi is chief executive officer of Koala Company, Ltd., an international trading company, and is also a past director of the Busan Sports Association.

President Choi and his wife, Seung-Bok, have one son, four daughters and two granddaughters.
