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Housekeeping

eing the start of another Lions Year, it's important to check whether any new signatories need to be added to your club's accounts. Usually the Past President retires from that duty and you have your new President, Secretary and Treasurer as authorised signatories.

Any new signatory will need to provide your bank with:

- a) a completed signatory form
- b) sworn declaration (by a JP) of their photo ID and proof of address
- c) their personal IRD tax number.

They will also have to visit a bank branch to identify themselves and sign the signatory form in front of a bank officer.

If adding a new signatory, your bank will require a copy of your Board Minutes showing the approval of that person as a new authorised signatory.

The above also applies to your club's charitable trust, with usually the new president and treasurer joining at least one already appointed trustee.

Club Treasurers will receive via email only, in mid-July, an International Dues invoice, covering the first six months of the new Lions year and later in July, they will receive via email only, one invoice covering MD202 and District 202J Dues for the first six months of the new Lions year.

If unsure about anything to do with signatories, dues, or any other financial matter, please contact District 202J Cabinet Treasurer.

♣ District 202J Photo Competition:

- An A4 **a photo that tells a story** of your club doing a project or fundraiser during the current Lions year. Attach a suitable caption and your club name. One photo entry per club. The photo can be printed on ordinary photocopy paper it doesn't have to be photo quality paper.
- F Send your club entry to the current District Governor, to be received by a specified date

Doake Cup (best club support of Youth Activities):

- \$\P\\$ Keep a record of all your youth activities throughout each year.
- Tuse your record to complete the entry form distributed to your club.
- Framework Send your completed form to the Youth Activities Chairman for your zone by a specified date.
- **Note:** the judging period covers January 1 to December 31 the second and first halves of two Lions years.

Gaye Broker Membership Growth Award:

- Presented annually to the club with the greatest nett membership gain (excluding deaths and transfers) over a one year period from 1 March to 28 February.
- In the event of a tie the club with the smaller membership at 1 March is adjudged the winner.

Winton Shield (best club project):

- P Document your projects, including photographs if applicable.
- P Collate in a scrapbook.
- Send to the District Governor before September 30 each year (note: the applicable year is the immediately preceding Lions fiscal year: July 1 June 30). It will be judged and the award presented at the District Convention the following March. If it is a community service project the September 30 closing date enables the winning District community service project to be forwarded to Multiple District for judging in the Ron Usmar Award for Community Service (see http://www.lionsclubs.org.nz/Clubs/Resources-For-Clubs/National-Club-Awards/Ron-Usmar-Award) with that trophy being awarded at Multiple District Convention the following April.

♣ Tunnage Trophy (best dressed club):

- The press in keeping with the Convention Saturday night dine & dance theme.

osgiel District Lions Club president John Stewart rarely finds himself lacking female company. The club has more female members than male - its largest gender divide since the club was founded in 2007.

Mr Stewart, of Mosgiel, said the club had 20 members and 75% of them were women.

Club member Rebecca Matthews, of Mosgiel, said a factor for the divide was many of the women being widows.

Mr Stewart said when the club was founded it was closer to a 50/50 share of men and women. The induction of Lynne Smith and Sharyn McGlynn at a club ceremony in Mosgiel last week and four women transferring from other clubs strengthened the percentage share of ladies at the club.

The members' ages ranged from 35 to 85. New members were always welcome. "We are a very happy club."

The club's motto "We Serve" had members at fundraising events such as sausage sizzle, manure drives, street appeals but it wasn't all work as regular social events were held, such as dinners, a Melbourne Cup day, Christmas parties and card nights.

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

rganisation for two Trust luncheons, one in Timaru and one in Dunedin is underway. Both will have interesting speakers. For those who have never attended they are a great way to catch up with fellow Lions from around the District.

Invitations will be sent out. But I would say that if you are a **Lloyd Morgan** recipient and you know the luncheons are coming up and haven't received an invitation, just register to attend, don't wait. Information on dates and venue will be in J-Times in the near future.

29 clubs out of 35 from our District have so far donated a total \$16,250, a pretty good effort. And also three clubs have received back \$9,708 in grants. The clubs who have received grants are Dunedin South for the purchase of Robots for a school technology programme, Dunedin Balmacewen to assist with the purchase of defibrillators and containers to allow 24/7 access, and Oamaru for the purchase of a defibrillator.

The latest figures I have for the Capital Fund as of 31/05/219 stands at \$5,852,776 the income account \$212,969, Special Trusts \$897,561, and funds managed on behalf of others \$315,204 giving a total of all funds of **\$7,278,510**.

Cash available for grants and loans \$183,218

Finally I would like to ask the clubs who haven't as yet donated to please do so; wouldn't it be great to have 100% of our clubs donate this year.

Remember when donating, you can honour a member of your club or someone in the community with a Trust award. If your club has had a bereavement then how about donating to the Trust and add the Lions name on the Honour Roll. The Roll is maintained and is displayed at Multiple District Convention and electronically at District Conventions for all to see

My first year as your Trustee is coming to an end and I have learned a lot so far and I look forward to working with you over the next year.
