Thursday back at hospital, for another hectic days work.

Had freighted over [2400 pair prescription glasses](#) [1200 pr sunglasses](#).

We ran out of stock of 0.5 to plus 2.00 glasses and all the sunglasses

A very successful project and thanks to everyone who collected glasses, processed them and made it possible to help the people of Fiji improve their sight.

Lions of 202E are part of the “Voice” in this 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary Festival. 80 years of amazing young singers and musicians entertaining Christchurch. Perhaps you were part of this many years ago – I was, first as a singer, then parent of singers, then teacher of school choir singers, then grandma of singers, but most importantly for the last 20 or more years, as part of the Lions promotional team. In those 20 or so years, Lions Clubs in the “catchment” area of schools that participate have paid \$7000 a year, or \$250 per Club, to be the naming sponsors. For this, we get a full page Lions advertisement on the back of the programme, frequent mention, both verbally and on screen, during the concerts, and my main effort – a large Lions promotional display at the venue, which this year will see a return to the Christchurch Town Hall. Schools from as far away as the West Coast and Cheviot are involved.

This year, in order to retain our naming rights, we have been asked to contribute a minimum of \$10,000, so I have been asking Clubs to consider increasing their donation, and thank you to all who have been able to do this. I recently contacted Clubs that have not yet made their annual contribution, or who have been asked to make their first contribution, and thank those Clubs who have responded. We are still short of that \$10,000 target, so can I ask those outstanding Clubs to urgently consider this. Payment details were in the emails I sent you.

The website “**Lions Christchurch Schools Music Festival**” has details of tickets sales, and the nights your local schools are performing. If your Club has sponsored this amazing youth project again this year, please make a date to attend one of the concerts, at the Town Hall on 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> November, and see where your donation goes. I look forward to you stopping off at our Lions display to say hello, as I will be there before the performance every night – and I repeat my offer to include information on your Club in the display.

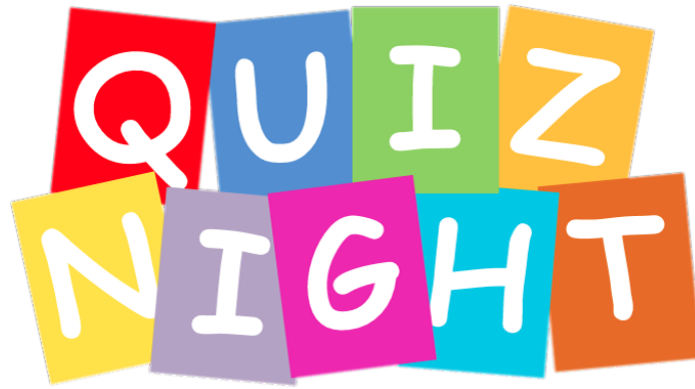

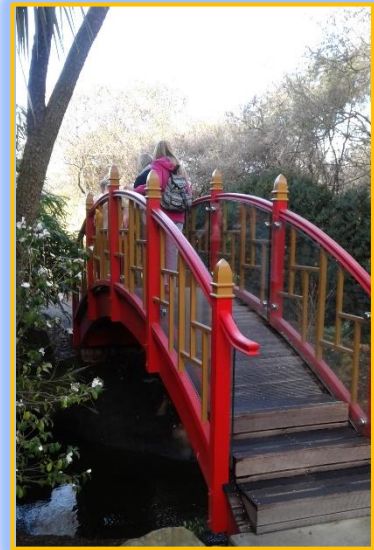
