
Reimbursements will be paid in November 2019, February 2020 and May 2020 and there is - **NO LIMIT to the number of claims a club can make before 30th June 2020!**



Focus on Zone 6 News

If the Clubs in Zone 6 continue with fundraising and social activities. As three of these clubs have small memberships the contributions made to their local communities cannot be underestimated.

It is with sadness that the Zone has had three members pass away.

. Dunedin South:

This small club continues to work hard in their community. They ran a very successful Taieri Train trip and walk.

♣ Green Island:

Their food caravan has been in demand at local school fairs; they have been bagging sawdust and working at the gardens of Sister Veronica over the last two months.

♣ Milton:

A vibrant club, furthest south in our District. They have a very successful ongoing manure stall along with firewood sales. Catered for a large clearing sale with approx 600 people in attendance. Coming fundraising events they are involved with include a trail bike ride, lamb tailing, the local A&P Show and a food bank drive in December.

♣ Mosgiel District:

A growing club with a lot of enthusiastic members. Their ongoing projects include a fertiliser drive, freesia and lily bulb sales, BBQs, Meals on Wheels, Kantabs, glasses and old money. They have supported local groups including Foster Hope Otago and Mosgiel Volunteer Fire Brigade.

♣ Otago Peninsula:

This small club has undertaken a large project with upgrade work on the Buskin track on Otago Peninsula. Local community supporters have helped with labour and they have been assisted by donations of materials from Department of Conservation, Bunnings and Adhesion Sealing.

♣ Strath Taieri:

A country club that has been cutting firewood for the community and have organised a 'Meet the Neighbours' evening in November. Their new chocolate wheel has been put to use.

♣ Taieri:

Members have been working within the local community along with support to the Outram and Lee Stream Schools. Their largest project has been in conjunction with Taieri Rotary Club holding the annual Winter Brassica Competition & Charity Auction. The club has continued to provide members for gate keeping at the Wingatui Races and the Dunedin Marathon. Ongoing firewood cutting and recently supported a young local who represented New Zealand in Hong Kong at a pony club competition. Members have had club visits to Dunedin South, Owaka and Port Chalmers.

Completed forms must be received by Monday 16 March 2020


Any Lion who has not yet served as President is eligible to apply. This course is excellent preparation for those who are about to take on Board roles, particularly those of President or Vice President.

D iabetes is a global epidemic, affecting an increasing number of men, women, and children all over the world. Diabetes can lead to serious diseases affecting the heart and blood vessels, eyes, kidneys, nerves and teeth. In most high-income countries, diabetes is a leading cause of cardiovascular disease, blindness, kidney failure, and lower limb amputation. It is expected to affect 629 million adults by 2045.

LCIF's Strategic Objective is to reduce the prevalence of diabetes and improve quality of life for those diagnosed. Some Lions Clubs in New Zealand partner with Diabetes NZ and other local Diabetes associations to work within our local communities to make our communities aware of Diabetes and the threats that this poses. Many clubs run special walks for all ages in our community. Clubs also run Health Awareness events and often have diabetes and blood pressure checks available on site from gualified professionals. Some run Healthy Eating Programmes, provide emergency diabetes packs for times of disaster and sponsor youth to Diabetes Youth camps. In partnership with the International Diabetes Federation (IDF), LCIF are on a mission to make a mark by screening 1 million people for Type 2 Diabetes this month.

November is "World Diabetes Month" with the 14 November being "World Diabetes Day".

I would like to encourage all clubs in 202J to consider organising an event in November to bring awareness of diabetes to your communities. Following are some suggestions:

- Work with Diabetes NZ or a healthcare professional to organise an educational talk about diabetes, pre-diabetes, prevention and management at your club meeting, opening it up to invite your local community along. Use this link to find the Diabetes branch nearest to you <u>www.diabetes.org.nz/branches</u>
- Facilitate a discussion about diabetes to encourage club members to share their personal connections to the disease. This could be personal to them or to a member of their family or friends.
- Share a low glycaemic (carbohydrate) snack at a club meeting and ask a nutritionist or diabetes educator to teach club members about interpreting food labels and finding the right foods to help those with diabetes.
