Berwick Outdoor Experience

 \P he realisation resulting from the cancellation of this year's course, set to be the twenty ninth, has finally sunk in. Up until the cancellation, the organisation was proceeding well. The registrations were building up steadily, the organising committee, and the instructors, were on track and fully committed to deliver the eight day programme, in line with the past success of this rewarding project.

For me personally, having been involved with the course since its inception back in 1989, it was a heart wrenching decision to accept that in the current viral world, it would be a no brainer to proceed with the course arrangements, from the middle of the month of March. This was a huge disappointment, for me, the Taieri Lions Club, the instructors, and a let-down for the participants already registered, and organising their lives to be able to attend.

With the prospect of the Lockdown, our hand would be forced anyway, and it just wasn't going to happen.

However, unlike the sinking of the Titanic, the course is completely retrievable, and all is not lost. It is just a matter of time; 12 months in fact, until we are able to re-connect with the delivery of the project, and build on the tremendous success we have had with the course. A major factor, we do not have financial overheads, this is a non-profit-making venture, a 'peoples project'.

The course success is not just due to the organising team and the instructors, but to the on-going support received from the many sponsors and supporters, the foundation for the success.

For many of the supporting Lions clubs in 202J, other service organisations, businesses, past participants, and friends, your effort leading up to the cancellation, sourcing participants from the community was well down the track. The Taieri Lions members, along with the organising team, have greatly appreciated the 'hard yards' (they are often hard yards) that had gone in to finding suitable participants, and putting up sponsorship to encourage these people along.

With the abandonment of any event, where considerable energy has been spent, there is always a feeling of deflation, when the event just does not happen.

There is no need for me to reiterate the value of the Berwick course, and the benefits that it provides for the participants.

Georgina Chase, a member of the Blue Watch in 2015 sums it up superbly:

Challenges have been set, battles fought What we have accomplished, I would never have thought Journeys to destinations that I did not know So many times felt like packing up to go People that to start with meant nothing to me Have become like family and I am always happy to see Courage found when I felt there was nothing left Memories and friendships made, forever to be kept The helping hand received and given at times needed

Paid back with the look of accomplishment succeeded

Team for this week but friends forever

Striving through to the end as one and together.

I am confident that once the unprecedented situation we have at present settles down the organising team will be well positioned to pick up the threads very easily. With the inevitable backlash from the Lockdown of the country, the resulting unemployment and social problems will emphasise the need within the community, to provide this humanitarian opportunity! There will be a lot of re-building necessary for many who have had the path of their lives changed so dramatically.





After breakfast, we jumped into Sue's car and took them on a whistle stop tour of Port Chalmers. The photo was taken by the new picnic bench our club has installed at the top of the new pathway leading from the Flagstaff down to the beach.

The only downside was the weather! Having had sunshine for days, we were out of luck. There was low cloud and rain, so our guests couldn't see any of the beautiful views. However, they seemed to enjoy their visit and got back to France just before the virus struck!

LCIF are responding to the coronavirus epidemic making grants available to support regions with extreme COVID-19 cases. The focus of these grants are on addressing the needs that exist within local medical and emergency management systems, that are in keeping with the World Health Organisation and the Centre for Disease Control & Prevention guidelines.

Applications to be considered need to follow the "Emergency Grant" criteria:

- 1. At least 100 plus people being infected (confirmed cases) in the immediate area.
- 2. Maximum grant \$US10,000
- 3. Funds only to address active and immediate cases.
- Funds for Lions to work with local medical and emergency management services that are addressing the outbreak ie for use of sourcing medical supplies, quarantine related expenses etc for those infected.
- 5. All requests will be considered on a case to case basis.
- 6. All donations will be MJF and Campaign 100 eligible.
- Donations for COVID-19 response are being accepted through LCIF's General Disaster fund

 the funds will be used to help the fight to keep desperate families and communities safe.

At the time of writing this article on 14 April, all Lions clubs are in lockdown however some are still conducting Lions business electronically or there is the option of having meetings via Zoom. When you

are looking at distributing your charitable trust funds at the end of your Lions year, please don't forget LCIF. If your club hasn't donated this year, can I please ask you to give your utmost consideration, so our Foundation can continue to support those so desperately in need around the world. It should be noted that one of DG Kevin's goals is to have all clubs in our District donate to LCIF Campaign 100 this year. Whilst DG Kevin and First Lady Glenis sadly missed the opportunity to host the 202J Convention because of the virus, here is a way to show your support of DG Kevin and have 202J recorded as the DG with 100% participation for Campaign 100 in this Lions year. As at 14 April, 62 COVID-19 grants had been made totalling \$US1.85 million.

A special thanks is extended to all clubs in 202J that have responded to the Australian bush fire appeal. Some clubs donated water tanks at \$AU3,000. I would like to make a special mention of Rakaia Lions who donated three water tanks. Having attended an LCIF training in Sydney in March hearing first-hand of the need for funds, and in particular water tanks, I was able to share with them the support from 202J. To say the least, they were very humbled by the support from our District, and in fact from all Districts in NZ.

On behalf of LCIF, thank you for your continued support.

Preparing for MyLCI Reporting

Club officers 2020/2021 year

nce your club board for 2020/2021 has been elected the names for each position must be reported to Lions Clubs International via My LCI before 15 May.

Prepare now for filing your incoming officers' report by ensuring all members' data is correct in the MyLCl website (where you do your monthly electronic reporting of membership & activities). This is the information that will be included in the report & subsequently in the Multiple District & District directories - incorrect information within MyLCl means errors in the directories.

Check & update data for all members, but the critical ones for the 2020 - 2021 incoming officers' report are:

President

- 1st & 2nd VPs
- Secretary
- Club Administrator (the person who does MyLCI reporting)
- ◆ Treasurer
- Membership Chairman
- LCIF coordinator
- Club Service Chairman
- Club Marketing & Communications Chairman
- Directors.

These are the members you are going to add as Officers of your club for the 2020-2021 Lions year. Ensure details are entered as proper sentence format (i.e. not all capitals)

Follow these steps:

- Go to: https://www.lionsclubs.org/en
- Click: MEMBER LOGIN (in white text on black background at top middle)
- "Welcome to your Lion Account" appears
- Choose Sign In if you already have a user name & password,
- ◆ Otherwise choose Register & create your Lion Account . You will be asked "Have you registered on the MyLion app? No/Yes" (for smartphones)
- Once signed in click "GO" under the MyLCI section at the left
- Enter your user name (or membership number if you haven't created a user name) and password and click Submit - (Club Home Page appears)
- Click "My Lions Club" (gold text on the dark blue band near top), then "Members". Click on member to have details updated. Click on "Edit Member" at right hand side.
- A new window called "Edit Member" appears. To the right of "First Name" click on the "Change Member Information Request" box.
- ◆ Another window called "Change Member Information Request" opens. Insert the changed details in the fields (boxes) at the right under the heading "Change To".
- If making a name change enter the details in the field (box) "Reason for Name Change".
- If making a birth year change enter the details in the field (box) "Reason for Year of Birth Change".
- Click on "Submit". A confirmation of submitted change window appears.
- If a birth year or name change has been made then it may take LCI a few days to process. The LCI Member Service Centre will send an email once they have processed the change.

Apply soap.




Rub hands palms to palms.



Rub the back of each hands with fingers interlaced.




Rub palms together with fingers interlaced.
