LEST WE FORGET: Woodend War Memorial

A memorable

The Lions Club of Woodend are excited to report that construction of the memorial is complete and wish to acknowledge the efforts of our contractor, Peter Dunn of Dunn's Stone-masonry of Rangiora, and the Waimakariri District Council. It is indeed special to see the memorial take shape and we trust it has been well received and embraced by the community of Woodend and surrounding districts.

We also wish to acknowledge the financial support we have received from the community and funding sources, which has made this project possible.

The opening ceremony was an auspicious day for our club as it was the culmination of our project to provide Woodend with a war memorial. Our club identified that Woodend did not have a memorial, unlike most other NZ cities, towns and villages.

2 years ago, the Lions movement celebrated 100 years of existence in NZ and clubs were encouraged to engage in Centennial Community Legacy projects which are visible gifts to communities that create a lasting legacy of our service contributions and this was when the Memorial project was conceived.

Initial discussions were held with Chris Brown of the greenspace team at WDC and on his recommendation we made contact with Peter Dunn, Stonemason, of Rangiora, and this area of land was made available. Design concepts were discussed and we wanted a modern, fresh and unique approach so the "pill-box" design was developed.

Construction was project managed by Grant Stephens and his team at WDC and our club has appreciated how well the project has come together. Thank you to everyone who has supported this project and helped make it a reality.

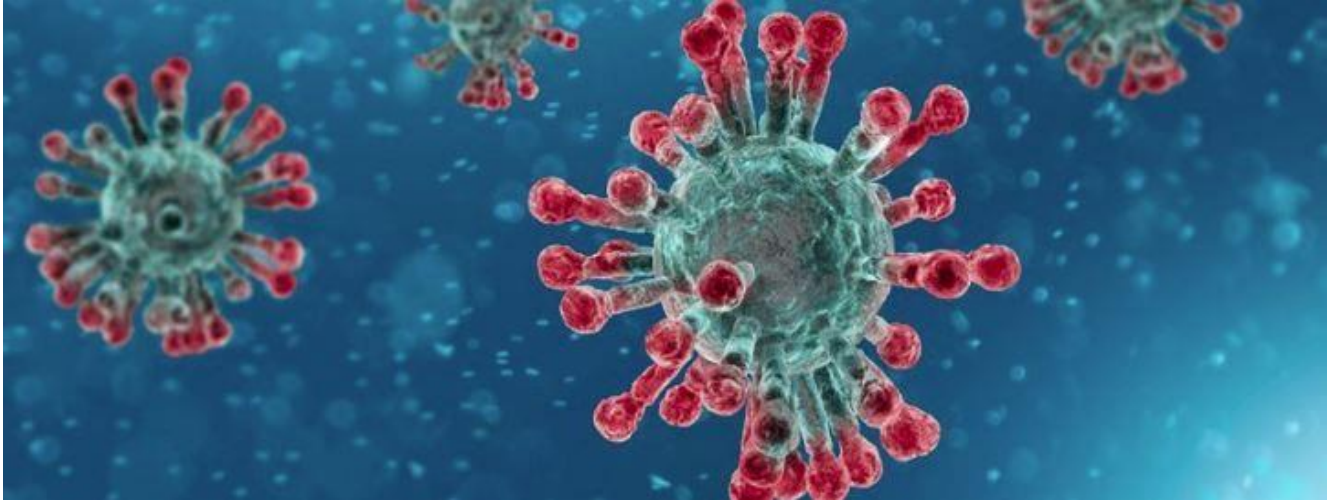
For many years Ross Ayson has single handily collected many bags of unwanted used spectacles from the various optician outlets in Blenheim and this year has been no exception.
