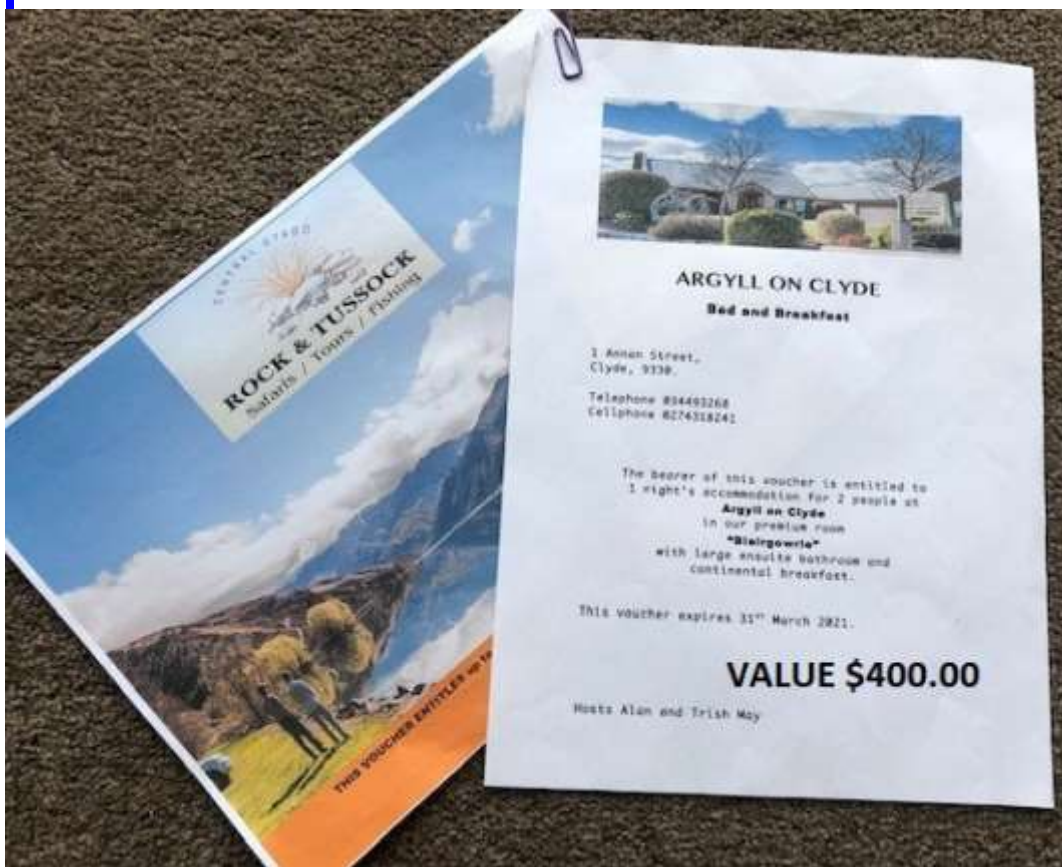

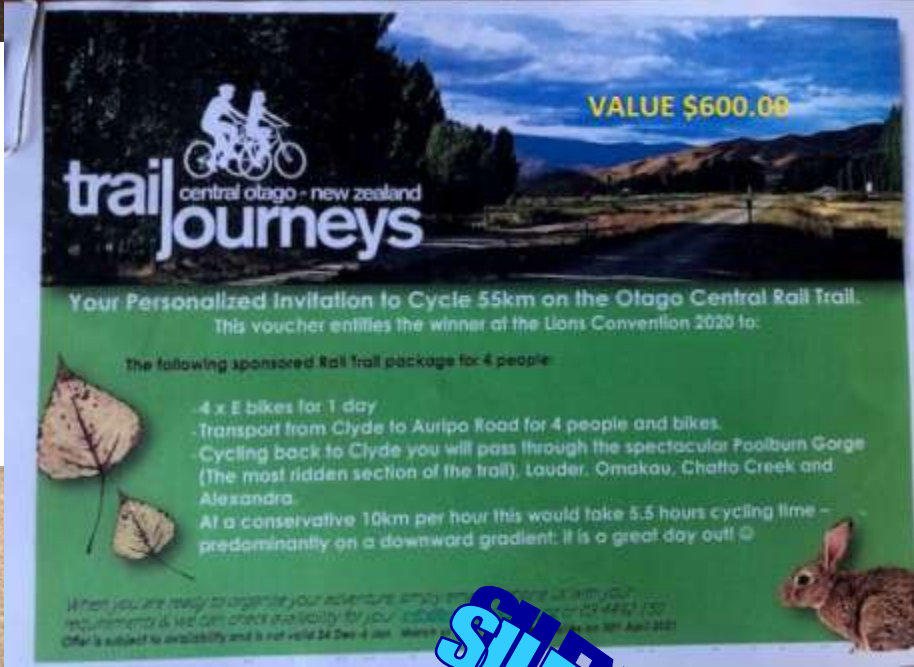

Hello Lions -

I hope this finds you all safe and well in these very trying and challenging times we find ourselves in under the impact of Covid-19.

The trustees of Borland Lodge Adventure and Education Trust appreciate the support that 202F Lions have given the lodge over the years, and due to these extreme times is appealing for your support again. Lions 202F have had a very long involvement with Borland with many of you having experienced the special qualities that help make Borland Lodge one of the jewels in Southland's crown.

Borland has been providing unique outdoor education and leisure activities to schools, New Zealanders and their families as well as visitors for nearly 50 years.

The Trust functions as a charitable trust operating on a very tight financial line with a small annual profit. This lock down period has had a serious impact on cashflow. We are fortunate with the employment of our excellent and dedicated managers, but with only a modest cash reserve, cannot endure a significant decline in income while continuing to maintain the facility to the required standard. There are no outstanding maintenance issues currently but due to the testing climate and vermin in Western Southland, means occupancy is critical to maintaining the infrastructure. Fortunately bookings are coming in from mid October onwards with a number of people rebooking their time they have lost due to the lock down.

Due to the standing costs, insurances, wages etc we need to bridge a funding gap created by the lock down until hopefully we are operating in some form again. Even after strict scrutiny of all standing costs the shortfall will be in the area of \$35,000.

A collaboration process with other outdoor education providers is being looked at as it offers an ability to lobby Government agencies. To date this has already had some positive feedback from Government ministers and local MPs but will not be in time to address the immediate cashflow crisis. What Borland Lodge Adventure and Education Trust needs is occupancy to create cashflow. We have set up a Givealittle page to see where that takes us.

Clubs could donate in cash or purchase bed nights which could be redeemed at a later date. Any type of support would be most welcome. After this time of uncertainty, a welcome rest at the Borland Lodge facility could be just what is needed.

Hello,

My name is Deborah Lagdon & I have been a member of the Orewa Lions Club for 4 years during which time I have been actively involved as part of the project management team for Orewa Lions Annual Big Dig & Hot Diggety Dog Show.

I have recently retired from 45 years in Business Banking hence my interest in "Money" so I have agreed to take on the position of MD Coordinator of the *Heads Up 4 Kids project*, that has been running for 10 years but appears to have been somewhat "forgotten" over the last 3-4 years.

Heads Up 4 Kids (HU4K) is a worthwhile project which involves the collection of old NZ coins & all (old or current) foreign notes & coins, which are then sorted by Lions members before being returned to the Reserve Bank of NZ.

The proceeds raised from these coins are used to provide a helping hand for young people, individuals or groups, to engage in an experience or activity that will enable them to live their dream, establish life goals & reach their full potential e.g. Outward Bound, Sir Edmond Hilary Outdoor pursuits, Spirit of Adventure & other various New Zealand based leadership camps.

This has been a very successful project in the past with figures for the 10 years to the end of February 2020 being:

- 28,506kg
- 6,140,000 coins
- 14,800 Bank Notes
- \$591,100 Sales

2019 Annual Figures which included deposits received from 33 of our 338 individual Lions Clubs – only 10% of clubs are actively participating at present

- 1670.286kg
- 339821 coins
- 3679 Bank Notes
- \$40,478.92 Value

In addition Lions also despatched a crate with 500kg of foreign coin to Australia, and would expect to see the credit for that around May.

Grants paid out for the 6 month period 1/7/2019 – 31/12/2019 - 10 grants totalling \$16.8k

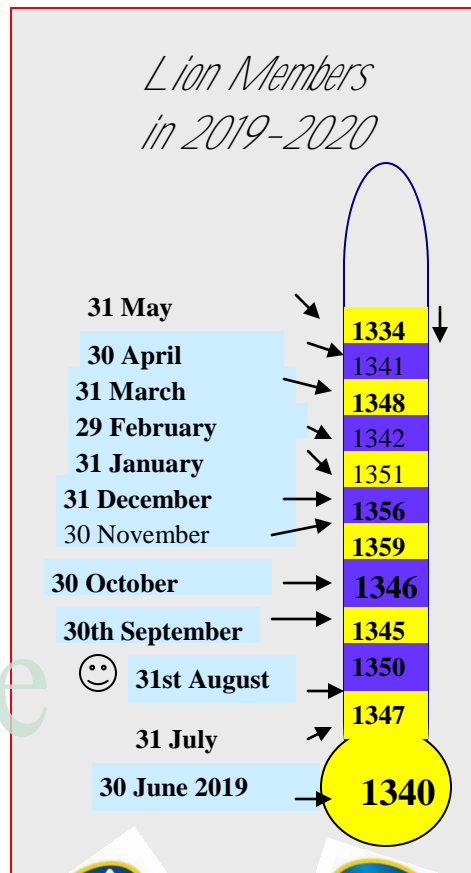

BNZ, ANZ to phase out cheque use BNZ is giving its customers just over a year's notice of its decision to phase out cheques. The bank said it would no longer accept cheques as of July 2021. It would work with customers to ensure they had alternative ways to access banking services by then.

"The number of customers using cheques has been declining steadily over the past five years and the increased use of digital and online services over the lockdown period has hastened that decline," said chief customer officer Paul Carter. "

We're giving ourselves and our customers plenty of runway to work with and our teams will be working proactively with customers over the coming 12 months to help them understand the transition and support options available.

"We have alternative solutions for the majority of services that traditionally use cheques and will ensure that by July 2021 next year everybody that uses cheques has an alternative way to access banking services."

ANZ said it was planning to phase out cheques over the next year, too, but had not confirmed timing. A bank spokeswoman said cheque use had dropped 20 per cent year-on-year between 2017 and 2018 and had fallen from there.

Fewer than 1 per cent of ANZ customers used cheques regularly. Kiwibank stopped accepting cheques at the end of February.

Westpac and ASB have been approached for comment.

- Physical distancing encouraged

ALERT LEVEL TWO: REDUCE

Contained but risk of community transmission growing

- Entry border measures maximised
- Further restrictions on mass gatherings
- Physical distancing on public transport
- Limit non-essential travel around country
- Employer to begin alternative ways of working if possible (shift work, working from home etc)
- Business contingency plans activated
- High risk people to remain at home (over 70s, people with existing conditions)

ALERT LEVEL THREE: RESTRICT

Heightened risk that disease not contained

- Travel in areas of community transmission limited
- Affected educational facilities closed
- Mass gatherings cancelled
- Public venues closed
- Alternative ways of working required and some non-essential businesses closed
- Non-face-to-face primary care consultations
- Elective surgeries and procedures deferred and healthcare staff reprioritised

ALERT LEVEL FOUR: ELIMINATE

Likely that disease not contained

- People to stay at home
- Educational facilities closed
- All non-essential businesses closed
- Rationing of supplies and requisitioning of facilities
- Severe travel restrictions
- Major reprioritisation of healthcare services

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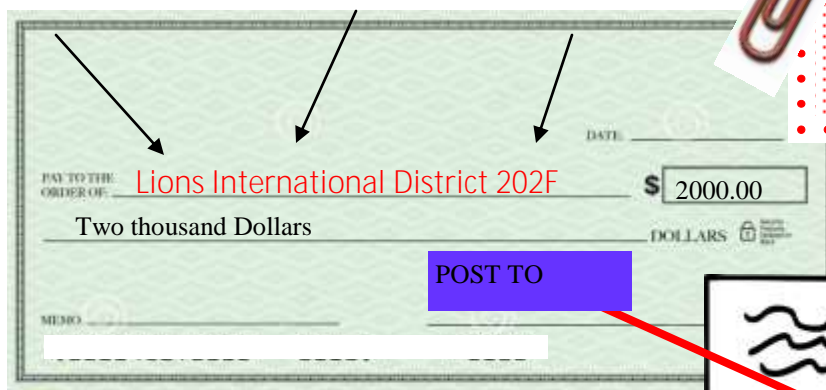
